Association News & Updates: April 2025



Hello from Bill Twyman and David Wellham – your friendly Delegates to Four Wheel Drive NSW & ACT (Association). Association documents are located on our website. Please contact via email at - delegates@subaru4wdclub.com.au for information about these topics or in relation to the Association. Looking forward to seeing you all on the tracks or at a meeting soon.

At the recent Four Wheel Drive NSW & ACT (Association) Quarterly meeting the issue of camping in NSW National Parks was discussed at length.

In recent newsletters I have noted that there was a proposal to be presented regarding updates to camping bookings.

The proposal is to increase fees as they haven't changed for many years - except the booking fee that was introduced during COVID.

The proposed fees are as follows -

- Tier 1 Vehicle or walk-in access - Free
- Tier 2 Pit toilet - Between \$13 & \$22 a day
- Tier 3 + tables, barbecue - Between \$20 & \$36 a day
- Tier 4 + shelters - Between \$28 & \$54 a day
- Tier 5 + flush toilet, cold shower - Between \$38 & \$65 a day
- Tier 6 + hot shower - Between \$54 & \$89 a day

This means that many campsites that we have used, which only have a pit toilet will be at least \$13 a day whereas before COVID they were free.

Also, it is a lot extra just for a table and more for a shelter - we usually take our own tables, BBQ and only use the shelter if it is raining.

Examples of areas that we camped for free before COVID - Burralow, Abercrombie, Newnes etc etc etc. These will be very expensive compared to the past.

The position of the Association is that if it was free before COVID it should revert back to being free.

There should be no booking system for free campsites and it revert back to a 'first come' basis.

If there was a fee before COVID, yes increase the fee a reasonable amount.

The other issue is that if the fees increase there is no commitment to spend the income on National Parks, just another tax for consolidated revenue.

Answers to last month's questions ...

The weight of 4WD vehicle accessories such as winches and bull bars:

- a) Affects the maximum payload that a vehicle can carry
- b) Does not affect the maximum payload that a vehicle can carry
- c) Only affects the maximum payload if upgraded springs or suspension are not fitted

Steep hills are best descended by:

- a) Placing the transmission in neutral and using the brakes to control descent speed
- b) Using the hand brake to control descent speed
- c) Placing the transmission into the lowest gear possible (automatics and manuals) and allowing the vehicle to 'walk' its way down the slope at the slowest possible speed
- d) Placing the transmission into the lowest possible gear, depressing the clutch and slowly descending the slope using the brakes

If your vehicle begins to slide when negotiating a side slope, the best course of action is to:

- a) Exit immediately using the doors on the upslope side of the vehicle
- b) Turn up the slope and accelerate
- c) Turn down the slope and brake gently
- d) Turn down the slope and give a gentle 'blip' on the accelerator

If you have any particular requests for Driver Awareness activities, please let David, Bill, Alex or me know, and we will do our best to accommodate your request.

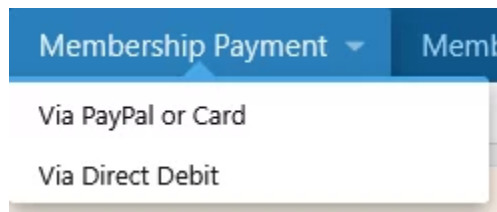
A Glossary has been loaded in the “Site Help” section recently.

Touring The Turon

Turon River - Wattle Flat - Bridle Track Trip Report

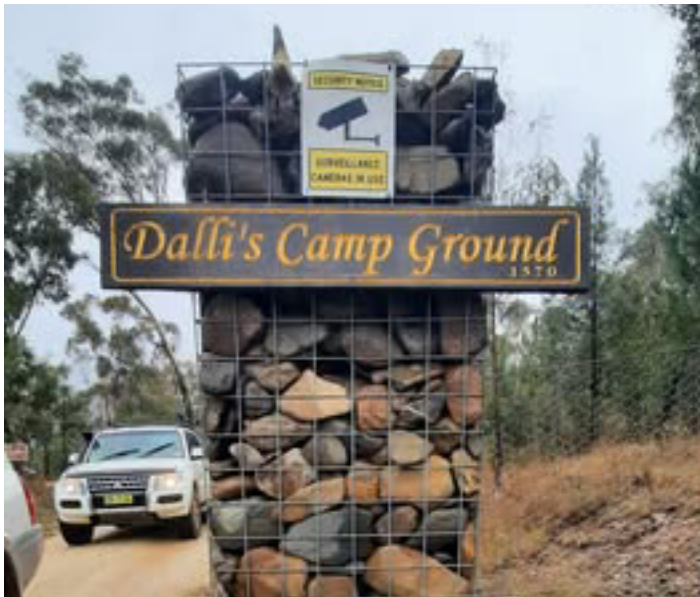
We all met up at Capertee on time and got away as planned. We headed off along the Turon Gates Rd into our cloud of white dust. The road was so dry and with the lack of any breeze we were having trouble seeing the road and unable to enjoy what normally is, lovely country side. We past The Turon Gates Eco Mountain Retreat and were amazed by the number of campers they had jammed into their camping area - hundreds of them, like bugs on a bumper.

Once we turned onto Palmers Oakey Rd the road surface got better & the terrain changed into steep hills & steep decents. We noticed a spattering of campers along the Palmers Oakey Creek but once we started to follow the Turon River we could not believe the number of campers, just about every square inch of available ground had tents, campers & swags. For the 20km into Sofala it was the same, wall to wall camping.

We had lunch at the Sofala Royal Hotel where Evie & Iwan, David & Andy later left for home. For the rest of us we setup up our camping gear at Wattle Flat and settled in for the night. Next morning back into the Sofala cafe for (an expensive) bacon & egg roll. The road to Hill End is asphalted all the way now so it was an easy drive. We took a drive through the Hill End Village Campground & there was not one available camp spot, full as a boot.

Then it was off to The Bridle Track, the track was in extremely poor condition, very dry and very dusty. And just like all the other previous campgrounds the track's campgrounds were littered with many happy little campers. The whole length of the track from Hill End to Bruinbun I'd say we passed about 60-70 vehicles, in sections we did a lot of reversing. For the 40km's of the dirt track section took a little over 2hrs to complete.

A big thank you to Dave Cook for planning and putting together the trip and a big thanks to all who attended and made it such a memorable event.



LET'S EXPLORE K'GARI (FRASER ISLAND)

We started at the Noosa River North Shore Ferry @1000 Monday and headed for the beach, airing down just before the dunes. It's a long drive up the beach to Double Island Point and still plenty of beach left after Alfred for an enjoyable drive. We went for a walk to the Lighthouse only to find the track closed so a good view south was enjoyed regardless. Back to driving and an attempt was made to go along the front towards Rainbow Beach till the tide was going to beat us so a retreat to the alternate rainforest track for a nice sandy bush drive into Rainbow. We stayed at the Big 4 out near the boat ramp, heavy rain that night.



Tuesday morning sees us having a look around the local area, a walk to the Carlos Sandblow, a look at the damage from Alfred at the main beach, then heading for Inskip Point Ferry pretty much straight on and K'gari here we come. Heading up the beach was another good drive with a stop at Eurong for a look/refreshment break, then off to Cathedrals to set up camp for the next 6 nights. Luckily for us we had just finished setting up when the rain arrived.

Wednesday morning turns out showery but we go looking and check out Champagne Rock Pools, now very sandy on to Orchid Beach then out to Wathumba Inlet on the west coast. A very wide estuary good for fishing and or family picnic & swimming. We got our chairs and picnic gear out only for a heavy downpour to make us scuttle that one, haha. We returned to Orchid Beach for

a refreshment break under cover, funny how it doesn't rain then. Out to Waddy Point for a look then onto the track south for camp. I should mention that by this stage we have seen more dingoes than we can keep count of, tagged and not.

Thursday we head out for a look at a couple of lakes on the way to Kingfisher Bay and have a civilised lunch at the resort after another great drive. On the way home we stopped at Central Station for a look then down to Eurong to make a round trip, then a run up the beach. I should mention that by now we have travelled up and down the beach highway at different tide times and there was still plenty of room even though a lot of sand has been washed away by Alfred. More rain heavy and light showers before lights out.

Friday sees us on another good drive through the hinterland north to south hitting one obstacle where I tore my front bumper off trying to climb a steep jump

up so we go a different way haha only to come across a large tree freshly fallen across the track. The next car arrived with a mad axeman who took to cutting the branches like a demon. Another vehicle coming the other way was able to winch remaining tree trunk out of way for us all to go. We get home safely and enjoy another camp kitchen dinner in between showers.



Saturday looks like good weather till it turns again. Dave has a lay day to tinker on the Triton. I ventured out and was determined to beat the track that stopped us earlier. Out with the shovel and a bit of road building saw it safe for all now and I'm through to go over to the west coast again to check out some ruins and come back on a round trip to the beach. Dave has had another look at the pools and surrounds and is happy with his rig now. We go out for dinner to Happy Valley and have a night run back up the beach.



Sunday we go down to Dili village and head inland on the Southern Lakes drive to check them out. They all have their own characteristics and are worth the look. This round trip takes most of the day and it was sunny rainy cloudy repeat.

Monday morning check out, wow, 0430 rain starts by 0500 bucketing, everything soaked just ready for pack up time, oh well, we cleared our site while rain refuses to give us a break and I'm so grateful for Daves help as I was crook from something I ate. We said our goodbyes to some fellow campers we befriended and headed off for the ferry. Another great drive and then over to Inskip Point where we said our goodbyes at air up.
